Thank you sincerely for your generosity and support of our agency. Without you, we would not be able to provide vital services needed by homeless men, women, children and families. These services greatly benefit not only our residents but the entire community!

Each year Bay Area Homeless Services continues to advance its mission through our emergency shelter and transitional living programs. Because of your generous support, residents have access to three nutritious meals daily and safe, secure housing while residing at Bay Area Homeless Services on their way to more desirable situation.

For example, Mr. MB came to the shelter in September after having lived on the streets for nearly a year. He had lost his job due to COVID-19 and was desperate for help. After encouragement and guidance from our case management staff, he found work in a local warehouse. He also found a second part-time position at a construction company and works there more than twenty hours weekly. During his stay at the shelter, he saved more than \$2,700 which he used to buy a used auto and make deposits on an apartment closer to his main job. He is so grateful for his stay he continues to return as a volunteer encouraging new residents!



\$1500 donated





- NAII Chattanooga is an active member of the Hamilton County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)






