- The Bay Area Homeless Services Center is currently helping families including 11 children between the ages of 2–17.

Boy ages: 15, 12, 9, 6, 5, 2

Girl ages: 17, 7, 5, 4

- What makes this shelter stand out is that they require their residents to work and help them find employment so they can eventually support their families. Residents can reside there for 90 days and sometimes longer depending on their circumstances.

Thank you sincerely for your generosity and support of our agency. Without you, we would not be able to provide vital services needed by homeless men, women, children and families. These services greatly benefit not only our residents but the entire community!

Each year Bay Area Homeless Services continues to advance its mission through our emergency shelter and transitional living programs. Because of your generous support, residents have access to three nutritious meals daily and safe, secure housing while residing at Bay Area Homeless Services on their way to more desirable situation.

For example, Mr. MB came to the shelter in September after having lived on the streets for nearly a year. He had lost his job due to COVID-19 and was desperate for help. After encouragement and guidance from our case management staff, he found work in a local warehouse. He also found a second part-time position at a construction company and works there more than twenty hours weekly. During his stay at the shelter, he saved more than \$2,700 which he used to buy a used auto and make deposits on an apartment closer to his main job. He is so grateful for his stay he continues to return as a volunteer encouraging new residents!

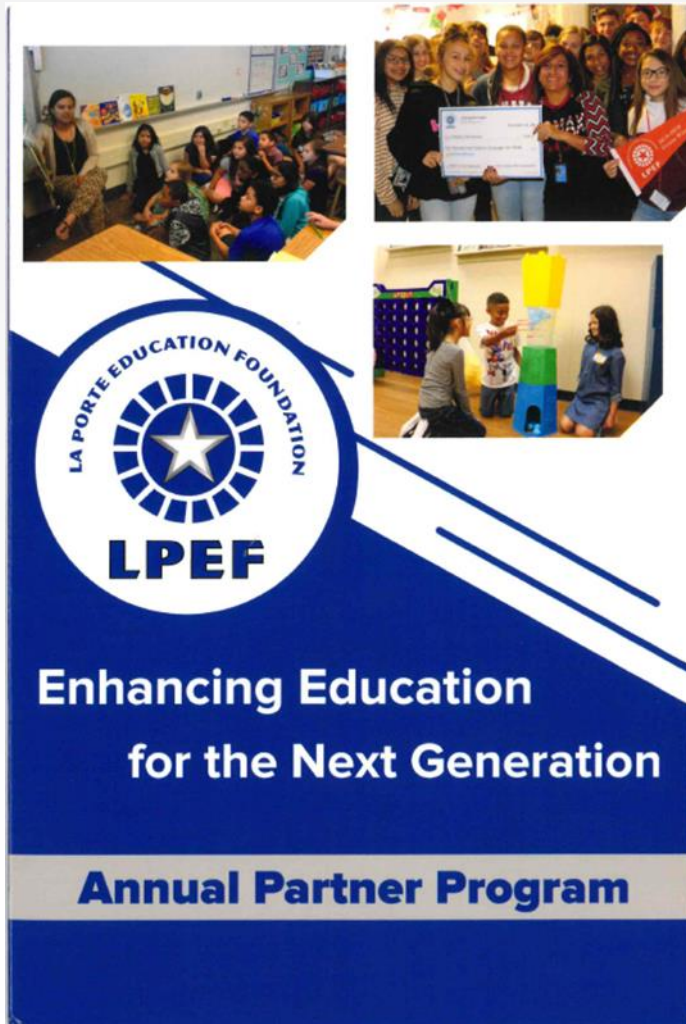

Grant: Oh, YES! It is Rocket Science!: School : La Porte Elementary This amazing engineering grant allows students to individually design and test variables by creating and testing mini rockets made from straws. Students can challenge themselves to change variables and make their rocket go farther or faster.

Grant: Ask 'EM!! School: Lomax Junior High This set of 30 dry erase boards will help students engage in every single lesson while receiving instant feedback on who is grasping concepts and who is not. This will give the teacher the opportunity to notice students who need more support on the spot. This is also awesome for vocabulary learning!

Grant: Social Studies Success: School: Lomax Junior High Socialstudiessuccess.com is a website that gears pre-made Social Studies lessons (both TX History and US History) to help teachers share in the excitement of teaching Social Studies. The pre-made lessons, which are aligned to the TEKS (Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills), will help teach students in an engaging way. Having these pre-made lessons will help ease the stress of having to develop all new material to reach our wide range of students.

- **Chattanooga Area Food Bank \$1500 donated**
- **Plus 102 lbs of donated food collected from employees**
- The Chattanooga Area food bank serves 20 counties and hundreds of food pantries in our community to work to end food insecurity in our area, as it affects 1 out of 7 Chattanoogaans.
- Each dollar provides 3 meals (used to be 4), so with the company donation and the employee food donation, we donated 4,585 meals!

\$1500 donated

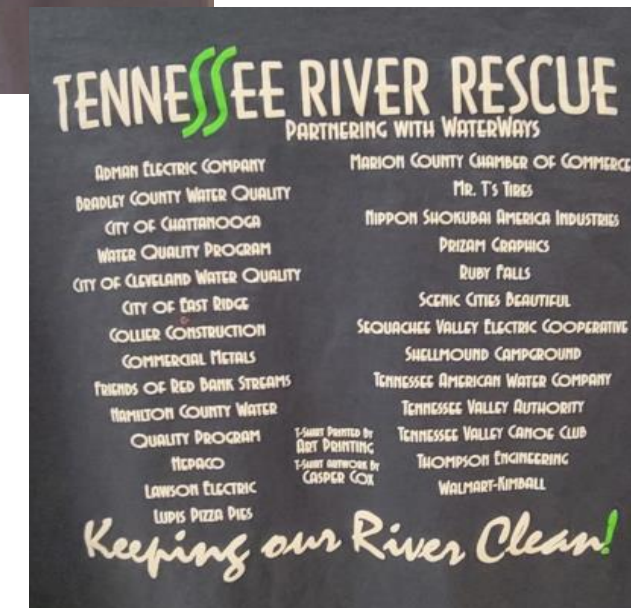
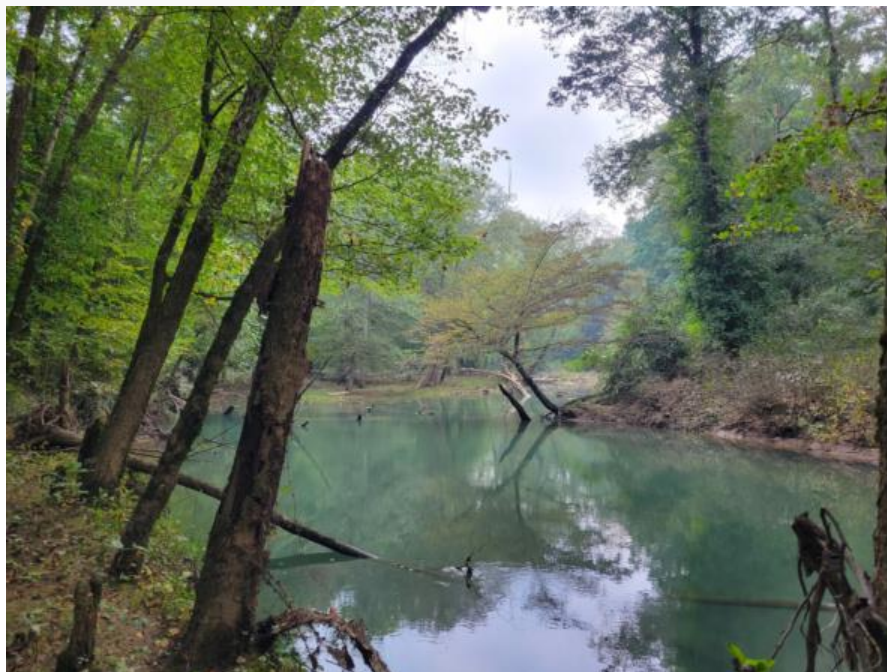

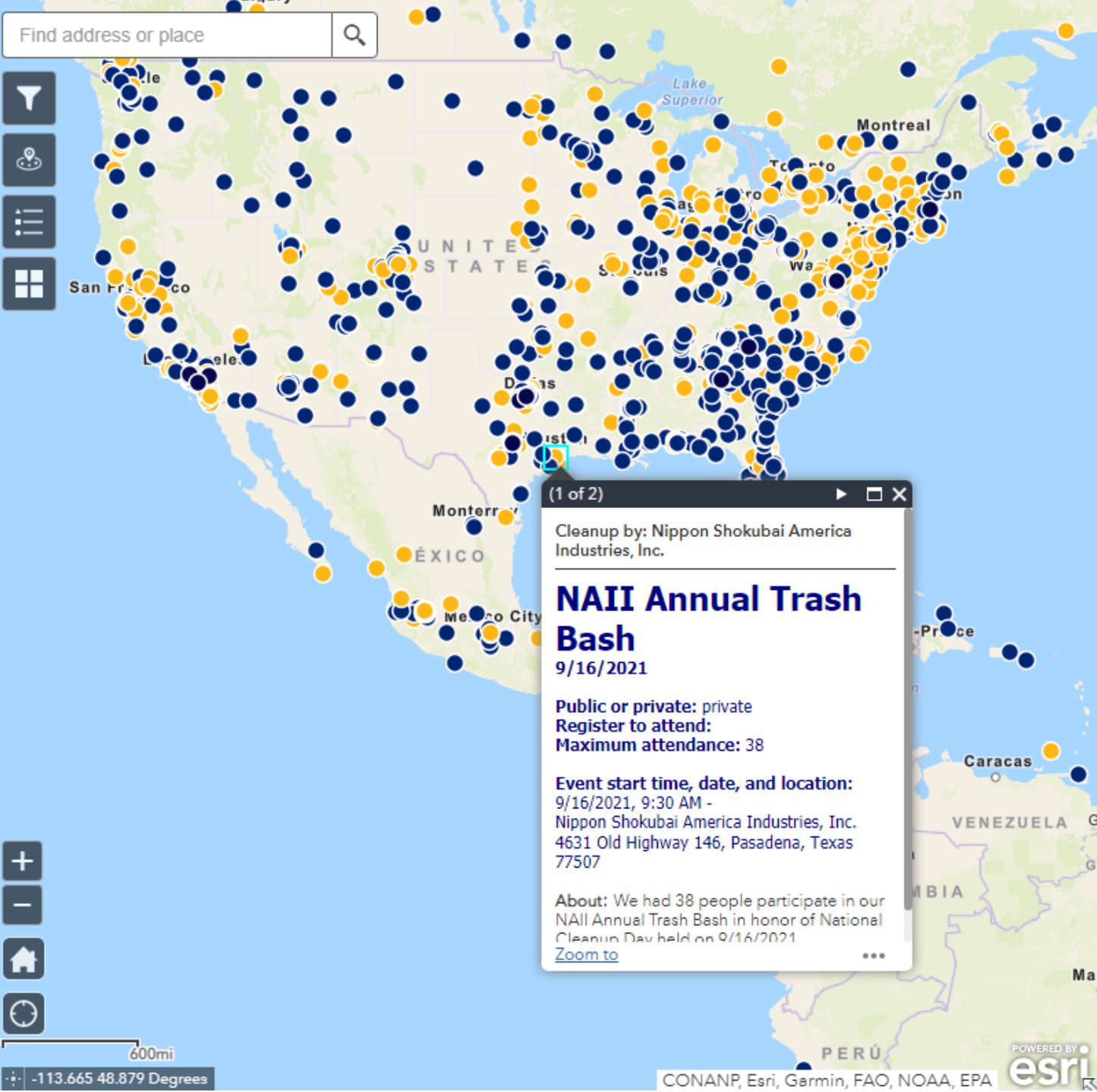


NAII Annual Trash Bash in honor of National Cleanup Day
